

Walmart Rezoning Hearing Continued

On March 2, 2015 the Plan Commission held a public hearing on the request to rezone approximately 10 acres of property located at the southeast corner of Ellerbusch Road and Highway 662 to allow development of a Walmart Neighborhood Market. During the hearing, the Plan Commission heard testimony from Walmart's representatives as well as Newburgh residents and other interested parties. At the conclusion of the testimony, the Plan Commission decided to continue the hearing until its next meeting, which will be held on April 6, 2015, at 5:30 p.m. at the Newburgh Town Hall. The Plan Commission's decision on a rezoning request serves as a recommendation to the Town Council. Once the Plan Commission acts on the request, the request will be scheduled for a further public hearing before the Newburgh Town Council, who will make the final legislative decision on whether to approve the rezoning. Plan Commission and Town Council member, Anne Rust Aurand, encourages citizens to attend the public hearings and to provide comments to the Town Council about the proposal. Sidewalks & Paving: a Work in Progress

The Town is kicking-off spring this year with plenty of bustle in the streets of downtown Newburgh. Sidewalks will be replaced on the north side of Jennings Street between Monroe and Washington. State Street will see portions replaced between Sharon Road and Main. Keep your eye out for construction beginning in mid-April at the very soonest.

With gas lines replaced and sewer issues addressed, Council member and Street Commissioner Alonzo Moore expects paving to commence as early as mid-April on sections of Water, Jennings, State, and Outer Gray streets as well as French Island Trail. Newburgh can look forward to many more beautiful new streets and sidewalks by the end of summer.

As always, weather and unforeseen circumstances can delay the progress of such projects, streets may be temporarily closed, and traffic patterns may be interrupted. Please contact Town Hall at 812-853-1720 with questions or concerns.
